



## **Hardesty House, 617 Knob Hill**

*Contemporary Craftsman, 2007*

This large six-bedroom home was built in the Craftsman style featuring an informal plan and an emphasis on structural members. The home was designed by architect, Gary Lane, and it kept many of the elements of the 1954 beach bungalow the previously occupied the site. The siding of the home is predominantly shingle. There is a small half-width porch with supports in a simple two-beam design over stone clad piers. The chimney has also been faced in the same stone. Other Craftsman features include low pitched roof, with wide overhanging eaves and triangular knee braces, and wood window surrounds. A unique paint color has locals stopping to take photos of the home, or if the homeowners are outside, they are constantly approached with questions about the paint color. The interior of the home features beadboard throughout and is decorated in a coastal color palette. With views of the ocean from the family's deck, the homeowners have filled the home with beachy objects. When the patio was poured, the homeowners added seashells to the wet concrete, however, the concrete was a little too wet and the shells sank almost out of sight....if you look closely, you can see fragments.
