



Heritage Court, “Queen Anne Museum”, 302 Flagler Lane

Queen Anne, 1904

A Redondo Beach landmark, this Queen Anne cottage was built towards the end of the Victorian period and exhibits period details such as turned wooden porch posts, large double-hung windows, fish scale shingled gable, and a high peaked roof. This home was originally built at 318 S. Broadway and was owned by J.E. Forbes. It was then occupied by Marshall Browne, who owned and operated the grocery at 302 Opal Street. This home was slated for demolition in 1989 and was acquired by the City and moved to its current location to be used as a museum. A small historically sensitive addition was added to the back of the house to allow for additional display space. This cottage has recently undergone a renovation and had been brought back to its previous historical splendor. The Queen Anne Museum houses an extensive collection of Redondo Beach memorabilia, information and artifacts and is operated by the Redondo Beach Historical Commission.
