



SeaCoast Church, 100 N. Pacific Coast Hwy

Mission Style, 1912

SeaCoast Church began as the First Baptist Church of Redondo Beach in 1909. The church is celebrating its 100th birthday this year! The building was erected in 1912 and is Mission Style featuring wood siding. It was originally located across the street. The structure was moved in 1929 to its present site and has undergone several remodels over the years as it expanded to accommodate its growing membership. The original part of the structure is at the southwest side of the complex. Its original windows were replaced in 1929 with the Gothic Revival windows you see today. The beautiful copper light fixtures in the original part of the church came from the old Bank of America building. The new auditorium, completed in 1967, features thirty-four beautiful stained-glass windows, made from chunks of slab glass grouted with portland cement, a French technique known as *dale de verre*, designed and fabricated by Cecil J. Wilson and Peter Ferrell. The Morrell family listed above was among the early church members. SeaCoast's senior pastor is Reverend Lee Huddleston.
